The training is 12 lessons/sessions. Currently the group meets once a week at Industries. Scheduling for a second group which will meet in the late afternoon will soon start. Once these sessions are completed a new group of Individuals will begin the

SOMETIMES DECISIONS HAVE TO BE MADE AT AN EARLY AGE



The decision to seek residential placement for a child is never easy, and sometimes it must be made sooner than the parents would like. Michael had two younger siblings who were 13 months apart in age. He needed to maintain an extremely strict schedule which at the time was not possible. When he was 6 years old his parents

placed him in respite care, where he would stay for 2 weeks at a time. After seeing the profoundly positive effect it had and how happy he was and how well he did in school, they just knew in their hearts, seeking residential placement was the best decision for him at that time. He was connecting with people and was eager to learn at school .

His parents saw that he needed more help than they could give him at home and while the decision to seek residential placement was very very tough they knew it was needed. Michael moved into a children's group home and flourished. His parents say when they saw this they knew in their hearts they had made the right decision for him. When Michael turned 18, they started looked at adult placement options and MILESTONE was at the top of the list. They said the staff patiently answered all their questions and were both supportive and sympathetic. The decision was made, Michael would move into a MILESTONE home when an opening became available. This also meant he could continue attending school in the Harlem District until he turned 21. His mother says, "He has lived at the same home for over 20 years. He loves his room,







the staff, his housemates and working at MILESTONE Industries. He is very happy with his life, his home, his job. He wouldn't change a thing, and neither would we." She adds they are not surprised because Michael has a smile for everyone, gives the best hugs, always says please and thank you and has a great sense of humor and loves to tease.



His parents also say, "Working with MILESTONE'S staff has been the bonus. They feel like they know everyone who is involved in his care and can call and talk to someone at any time. They communicate with us on everything, and that is something they want. They want to be a part of Michael's life and appointments and any medical issues that come up."

Michael's mother started a Down Syndrome group for parents with The ARC several years ago because she says it helps to know you are not alone. Her advice

for other parents is follow your heart. You are the ones who know how things are going. Make use of services as you need them and get involved in any group information offerings. Most importantly stay as involved as you can in every aspect of your child's life.

She added, "A parent must be persistent with every aspect of their child's care. It's not easy. Everything happens at a slower time, more effort must be made, illness is often present, and it can be incredibly challenging. But, MILESTONE can help with those things. That's what they do best."




