

IT TAKES A VILLAGE



We all know the saying it takes a village to raise a child. But when something changes in the child's village the impact can be far reaching. Michael's family found this out when his grandparents passed away and child care became an issue. Up until then Michael lived at home, attended school every day and took part in the Special Olympics program. Both of his parents worked and there were no programs with opening that could take him and there was no one who could look after him when he came home from school.

His Mom attended a parents meeting and learned about RocVale in Rockford, and even though there was a long waiting list the social worker urged her to look at the facility and if she liked what she saw to apply. His parents discovered Rockford was smaller than Chicago and very neighborly. They liked the fact RocVale had a Special Olympics program and that the children went on outings in the community. Within 2 weeks Michael was able to move to Rockford and finish High School at Guilford.

When he turned 21, his parents needed to find adult placement and at first were told MILESTONE did not have any openings. They looked at other facilities



and had picked one in Chicago, but they kept hoping something would open up at MILESTONE, and it did. They quickly asked that all the adult placement paperwork be switched so he could stay at MILESTONE.

His Mom says that was the best decision she ever made. She has watched Michael grow into a confident young man. Adding the staff at MILESTONE and his housemates are excellent examples for him and encourage him to keep learning and trying new things.







Michael enjoys going to work everyday at MILESTONE Industries and taking part in as many Special Olympic events as he can.

His mom says she is very glad she found MILESTONE for her son.

"Even though he lives in Rockford and I am in Chicago", his mom says, "I am still part of his life." She credits the excellent level of communication between her and the staff because they always tell her what is going on.
